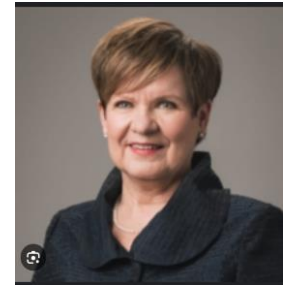

IMIA NI Honorary Member Kaija Saranto by Diane Skiba

Kaija Saranto, PhD, RN, FACMI, FAAN, FIAHSI is an Emerita Professor of Health and Human Services Informatics at the University of Eastern Finland, and the current President of the International Academy of Health Sciences Informatics under the International Medical Informatics Association (IMIA), and the chair of the European Federation of Medical Informatics (EFMI) working group for Education.

Dr. Saranto had a long, distinguished academic career of teaching and research in several universities, including as the director of the first Masters degree program in Health and Human Services Informatics accredited by IMIA. Furthermore, Kaija is an inaugural Fellow of the International Academy of Health Sciences Informatics, a Fellow of the American Academy of Nursing, and the American College of Medical Informatics. In addition to being an honorary member of IMIA NI, she is also an Honorary Fellow of the EFMI Nursing Informatics Working Group, the Finnish Nursing



Association, the Finnish Nursing Education Foundation, the Finnish Social and Health Informatics Association, and ACENDIO - the Association for Common European Nursing Diagnoses, Interventions and Outcomes.

Her awards include Knight First Class of the Order of the White Rose of Finland, The Finnish Nursing Education Foundation Sr, Pro Labore Omni Laude Digno Medal, and Venny of the Year Award.

She has held numerous leadership positions within IMIA NI such as Vice Chair of Working Groups (2012-2020); Chair, Vice Chair, and member of several international scientific program committees (SPC); Associate Editor, Editor-in-chief, editorial board member (NI 2009 and 2014), and referee of several IMIA-NI symposiums and scholarly journals. Kaija has also served as Vice President of IMIA and was responsible for organizing the MedInfo 2017 Conference in Hangzhou, China; Co-chair of the IMIA MedInfo 2015 SPC; and she was the 2009 IMIA NI SPC Chair for NI2009 in Helsinki, Finland. Further, Kaija has also supported and served on many European Medical Informatics conference committees.
